## Dear Concerned Parent:

I am a Christian pediatrician informing you of the following: Across the United States, pediatricians, lactation consultants, psychologists, and respected Christian leaders are expressing their concerns about a parenting program offered in churches by Gary and Anne Marie Ezzo of Growing Families International. Mr. Ezzo has a master's of arts in ministry designed for non-college graduates that gives credit for life experience. He is not in the position to contradict medical research and provide information on delicate professional topics, such as infant and maternal physiology and nutrition, lactation, and child development.

A flood of warnings without precedent has been issued to churches and the general public. Many healthcare providers, religious leaders, healthcare and Christian organizations, and journals have spoken out, including such experts as: Dr. T. Berry Brazelton, Dr. James Dobson, Dr. Penelope Leach, Dr. Laura Schlessinger, as well as, the American Academy of Pediatrics (which deemed GFI inconsistent with AAP recommendations and guidelines), Christian Research Institute (who deemed GFI "cult-like"), *Christianity Today* (which revealed integrity and character problems with Ezzo and GFI, and that he has been deemed unfit for Christian ministry by three churches spanning twenty years due to character issues), and England's National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children (which "condemned the guidelines as being responsible for babies failing to thrive, suffering psychological damage and even coming close to death"). Finally, on 10/1/01, Multnomah Publishers returned the publishing rights to Ezzo. Because of this widespread and negative publicity, it is now considered that churches may be legally liable if any problems occur while implementing and endorsing these methods. The pattern of Ezzo's character problems and the medical misinformation in his books continue to be of serious concern.
